Grant of Yearly Permission to Sardar Patel Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Sardar Patel Knowledge City Waraseoni Road, Dongariya, Post Chillod, Tehsil Lalbaurra, Distt. Balaghat-481331, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0659) with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26-reg.

Sir/Madam,

- 1) To assess the available facilities of teaching, non-teaching, hospital staff, practical training and other infrastructure facilities at your college namely Sardar Patel Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Sardar Patel Knowledge City Waraseoni Road, Dongariya, Post Chillod, Tehsil Lalbaurra, Distt. Balaghat-481331, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0659) inspection was conducted on 15.04.2025 and 16.04.2025 in hybrid mode as a part of annual visitation by the visitation team of Medical Assessment and Rating Board, NCISM to process the permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.
- 2) The visitation report and all other related documents were assessed in terms of enforced regulations namely the Minimum Essential Standards, Assessment and Rating for Undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and Attached Teaching Hospitals Regulations, 2024", provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant regulations thereunder. On careful examination of the assessment report following shortcomings/defects have been observed:-

1. Teaching staffs:-

a) Availability of total teaching staff for UG(BAMS) Course as per the part-1 submitted by the college and visitor observation is $\frac{Available}{Required}x100\% = \frac{34}{45}x100\% = 75.55\%$ (Excluding Excess)

- 3) The assessment report was placed in the 124th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) on 29.05.2025 On careful examination of the assessment report, considering the deficiencies observed therein the college was given an opportunity of virtual hearing vide the MARBISM letter (Hearing notice) of even no. dated 17.06.2025 to appear on 19.06.2025 before the designated Hearing Committee to present their case and to show cause as to why not the permission to your college with 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course under section 28 of NCISM Act 2020 for the academic session 2025-26 be denied.
- 4) The college was directed to make written submission in respect of the case and produce all relevant valid documents/records/proof against all the deficiencies/shortcomings as indicated in the hearing letter. The representatives of the college submitted written submissions vide letter. Ref. no. SPAMCH/PR-Off./303/2025 dated 18.06.2025 against the deficiencies conveyed to them. Whereas, the college through its representatives Dr. Subhash Waghe, Principal appeared before the Hearing Committee on 19.06.2025 and made their submission virtually as well as written submission against the shortcomings communicated to the college. The shortcomings communicated to the college, submission made by the representatives of the Ayurveda college and observations made by the Hearing Committee are as under:-

Shrikrishna Patil is now got linked. Hence, we would like to request you that since the linking of above said teachers is still under process; lacuna in this department should not be shown. Kaumarbhritya-Balroga:- In department lacuna of 2 higher faculties is shown and it is accepted. Despite our best efforts, we could not get the higher faculties in this subject. However, attempts to get them are still under process and we will be appointing them by the end of August 2025. Hence, sometime should be granted to us for fulfilling the higher post vacancy

Kayachikitsa:-In this subject, lacuna of one higher faculty is shown but now as the earlier non linked both professors Dr. Kamlesh Mutha and Dr. Manisha Ramteke are linked; this lacuna does not stand. Similarly, Dr. bhushan Kawale who is associate professor in this department and who was not linked earlier is also linked now.

The problem with linking of Dr. Dinesh Dulani is that one of the experience rows put by him is not getting deleted by any means due to technical error on NCI SM portal. If you delete that row, he will automatically get linked to our institute. Probably he will get linked soon. But on the portal he is being shown as teacher of our institute.

The render Dr. Rajiv Kopulwar is not linked to the institute on the ground that he has not done the registration of MP state. We already mentioned that registration process is very slow in MP state. The said teacher had already initiated the registration process in MP state.

The issue of third faculty Dr. Rajani Patale (Assistant professor) is that she is basically a postgraduate of shalya Tantra subject. Her initial appointment was in Shalakya Tantra in the year04/09/2019 as per the rules which is under process .But not uploaded of her M.P. State Registration certificate. teacher has already applied for her M.P. State Registration certificate. The teacher told that M.P. State Registration board may take up to one year for her the required issuing certificate. Submission may be considered.

- 4. Kaumarbhritya Balroga:-Deficiencies of two higher faculties in Kaumarbhritva department have been accepted by the college. **Deficiency Persists**
- 5. Kayachikitsa:- Dr. Bhushan Prakash kawle (AYKC00991)(Associate professor)not submitted part-1 but added in annexure and linked in OTMS. Dr. Manisha Ramteke (AYKC02093)(Professor) not submitted in part-1 but added in annexure and linked in **Deficiencies** OTMS. no longer persist.
- Dhage has resigned from the institute. Dr. Dhananiay Deshmukh(AYST01382) was uploaded as Associate Professor before submission of Part 1. However, his Promotion was approved by NCISM after the visitation. Deficiency no longer persists.
- 7. Shalakya Tantra:- Dr Dinesh Dulani. professor,(AYST01120), was not linked at the time of visitation due to a technical error. But, he got linked on the previous day of hearing. Submission may considered.

Dr. Rajiv Kopulwar associate professor (AYSK00482), Not submitted in Part 1 due to not linked in OTMS and filled restoring application form and uploaded joining letter which is process and under nonavailability of his M.P. State Registration certificate. The teacher has already applied for his M.P. State Registration certificate. The teacher told that M.P. State Registration board may take up to one year for issuing him the required certificate.

5) The observation of hearing committee based on the submission made by the college representatives during hearing and assessment report of the NCISM have been carefully re-examined in terms regulations, namely, "Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in the NCISM (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024, and provisions under the NCISM Act, 2020, the recommendation of Hearing Committee was placed in the 134th Board meeting of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine (NCISM) held on 16.07.2025 and Board concluded that the college is not fulfilling the notified & requisite criteria for issuance of permission as per the Concerned Acts and regulations but is fulfilling the criteria in accordance with the Board's policy letter issued on 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025. Hence, the Board decided to issue yearly permission with intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) Course in accordance with regulation 54(3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda regulations, 2024, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 for the academic session 2025-26.

"DECISION"

- 6) Therefore, yearly permission in accordance with Regulation 54(3) of MESAR UG Ayurveda 2024 and as per the Policy letter dated 09.01.2025 & 20.01.2025 is hereby granted to Sardar Patel Ayurvedic Medical College & Hospital, Sardar Patel Knowledge City Waraseoni Road, Dongariya, Post Chillod, Tehsil Lalbaurra, Distt. Balaghat-481331, Madhya Pradesh (Inst. ID-AYU0659) with an intake capacity of 100 seats in UG (BAMS) course for the academic session 2025-26, under section 28 of NCISM Act, 2020 subject to the condition that aforementioned shortcoming shall be fulfilled along with the following requirements: -
 - I. Minimum 15% of undergraduate seats of the permitted intake capacity of 100 seats shall be treated as all India quota. The counseling for seats under all India quota shall be conducted by respective counseling authority as designated by Central Government for A.Y. 2025-26 and counseling for the remaining 85% seats or as the case may be, shall be conducted by the concerned Counseling Authority of that State/UT. The permission of the college stands withdrawn if the college fails to comply with the aforesaid direction of the Central Government/NCISM for all India quota or the students admitted thereunder.
 - II. Determination of fee and all other charges in respect of 50% of seats in private Medical Institutions and deemed to be University should be as per the guidelines issued by NCISM vide ref no. BUSS/Fee/ASU/2022-23 dated 16.09.2022. Fees of the remaining 50% of seats are to be fixed as per the guidelines of Fee Fixation/Regulatory Committee (FRC) of respective State/UT/Deemed to be University.
- Admissions made in violation of the above conditions will be treated as invalid and action will be initiated under NCISM Act & Regulations thereunder.
- 8) Further, as per Sub-section (7) of Section 29 of NCISM Act, 2020, The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine may conduct evaluation and assessment of any University or medical institution at any time, either directly or through any other expert, having integrity and experience in medical profession, without any prior notice and assess and evaluate the performance, standards and benchmarks of such University or medical institution and if the college is found to be not maintaining the Minimum Essential standards as specified in the concerned Acts & Regulations then in accordance of Section 28 (1) (f) of NCISM Act, 2020 the issued permission of the college shall deemed to be withdrawn and denial of permission shall be issued by MARBISM for stoppage of admission for that particular academic year or the subsequent year.
- 9) Discrepancies, if any, may be immediately brought to the notice of Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine, NCISM.

- 10) Compliance report of all the requirements of Aadhaar Enabled Biometric Attendance System as mentioned in the implementation letters vide ref. no. 3/2024/MARB/AEBAS & HMS dated 09.05.2024 and 06.09.2024 issued by the board.
- 11) The following requirements must be fulfilled and the compliance report must reach the Board by 31st December, 2025 to be considered for the issuance of permission for the academic session 2026-2027:-
 - All the requirements under the provisions of the NCISM Act, 2020 and relevant Regulations made thereunder i) should be fulfilled.
 - All the requirements of Minimum Standard of infrastructure and teaching & training facilities as specified in NCISM ii) (Minimum essential standards, assessment and rating for undergraduate Ayurveda colleges and attached teaching hospitals) Regulations, 2024.
 - All the requirements of the National Commission for Indian System of Medicine (Minimum Standards of Undergraduate Ayurveda Education) Regulations-2022.
 - The remaining shortcomings mentioned in Para no. 4 above, shall be fulfilled.
- 12) The fulfillment of the conditions given above may be made within the time period specified and compliance report should be submitted by the college within the timeline as mentioned above to the President, Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine. The Medical Assessment and Rating Board for Indian System of Medicine will verify that the conditions have been fulfilled for considering the permission for the academic session 2026-27.
